	4. "Suspense" Any set ups that makes You curious?
Structure/narrative	<ul> <li>Presentation (of background and relevance)         Understandable? Enough or to detailed?     </li> <li>Articulation of "obstacle", "acceleration",- the new contract         Is it articulated?     </li> </ul>
	- Elaboration (description of research activities) (finally ;-) ) Understandable? Enough or to detailed?
	- Climax/anti-climax (the results) Understandable? Enough or to detailed? Pay off?
	- Landing your audience Is there a lead out to future projects, perspective, debate?
Performance	<ul> <li>What axis is dominant? (the oral, visualor the Bermuda triangle)</li> <li>Do slides support the spoken word? (number, information load, are they actively used)</li> <li>Is the spoken word understandable? (obese sentences, voice (volume, speed, pronunciation))</li> <li>Is the presentation read or told?</li> </ul>
Audience/ Target group	<ul> <li>Who is the presentation targeted? (The inner circle, circle 2-?)</li> <li>Could the presenter have made a different decision? How?</li> </ul>
The Message	<ul> <li>Is there a clear message (as experienced by the target group)? What is it?</li> <li>Is this message also the intended message?</li> <li>Are there to many messages?</li> </ul>
	Is the presenter still a member of the tribe? Or is that a completely irrelevant question?
